PROTECT YOURSELF. HANDLE CHEMICALS SAFELY.

Always take time to read and understand the entire pesticide label and detailed instructions before using or handling any pesticide.
Then re-read all bold print. Protect yourself by learning more best practices on handling chemicals safely.

1	Don't use a tank mixture of two or more chemicals unless the mixture has label clearance.
2	Don't hurry when using chemicals . Rushing promotes spilled chemicals, the wrong chemicals in the sprayer and the wrong rate of application.
3	When pouring and mixing chemicals, be sure the breeze blows the chemicals away from you .
4	Wear long-sleeved shirts, long pants, shoes, socks, and hat or scarf, rubber gloves, and chemical goggles to protect your yourself from pesticide residues. Wash all clothing, gloves and caps before wearing them again.
5	Apply chemicals on relatively calm days to reduce spray drift . Operate the sprayer at the lowest recommended pressure to minimize drift.
6	Mix only the amount of pesticide needed for the job . Use your best judgment when disposing of leftover spray or used containers. Rinse containers three times and pour the rinsate into the sprayer tank.
7	Thoroughly rinse sprayer tank and hoses before changing pesticides or repairing equipment. Contamination may not be completely eliminated but can be minimized
8	Be familiar with chemical poisoning symptoms . Dizziness, headaches, upset stomach, blurred vision and excessive sweating are symptoms of poisoning from several pesticides.
9	See a doctor any time you do not feel well and have handled a chemical within th past 12 hours. Take the label along so the doctor will know which chemical caused t

If a pesticide is spilled on skin, wash the affected area with soap and water.

Remove any contaminated clothing and put on clean clothes before continuing. If water and soap are not nearby, rinse in clean water from springs, streams or lakes.



Stay out of treated areas when told or when signs are displayed, and when a pesticide application is taking place.

Wash your hands immediately before you eat, drink, smoke, chew gum, use the restroom or phone.

Wash work clothes after each use and keep separate from non-work clothing.
