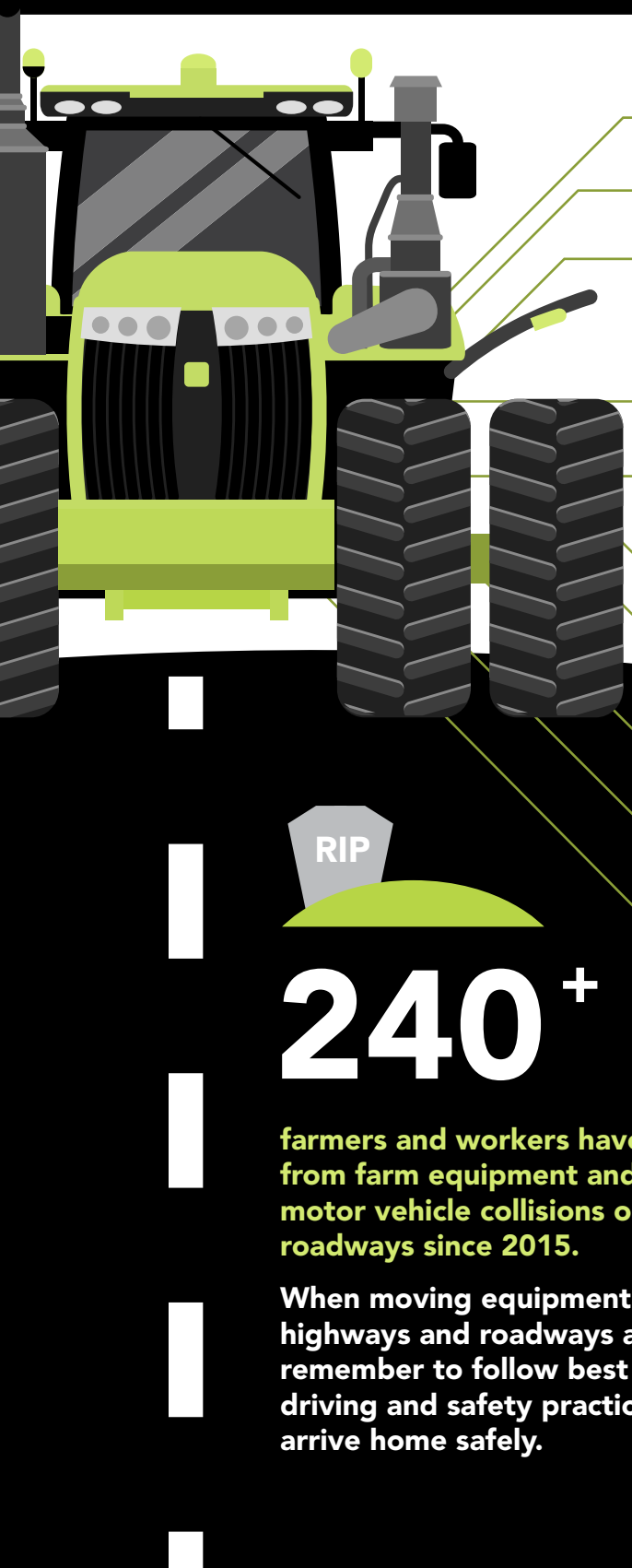


SAFE HIGHWAY TRAVEL TIPS

FOR AG EQUIPMENT



Obey all traffic laws and signs.

Avoid driving on public roads during rush hours.

Always be aware of what is going on around you. Remember, farm equipment can be difficult to maneuver. You will not be able react quickly to avoid an accident.

When possible, **allow faster traffic to go around you.**

Use a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) sign to identify equipment as a vehicle traveling 25 mph or less.

When towing equipment, **place the SMV emblem on the back of the equipment.**

If the vehicle has right and left brake pedals, **lock them together when traveling on a roadway** to prevent the vehicle from turning suddenly.

Maintain a safe following distance. It takes more space to stop farm equipment than passenger vehicles because of the size and weight of the equipment.

Make sure your vehicle does not come close to other lanes. When possible, stay to the right side of the road.

When possible, avoid driving at night. If you must drive at night, use appropriate lights.
